<mark>5.1</mark>	Finance update (Kane Mack)	
	KM provided Analysis Summary Report, showing spending has been mostly completed for the year and income, we are at 60% collection of Contributions & Charges to date. Home Economics consumables and Bus Hire will continue to draw down for the rest of the year Q: Is our transfer from reserves usually so high, no we have needed to support salary expense this year. We are working towards recovering reserve and saving money on salary next year. Q: Can the Education Dept help to support our relationships with primary school – PH advised there is still a lot of work that we need to do as a school. Final Contributions & Charges 2025 – for approval – all members given a copy for review. KM gave a description of what the breakdown of Voluntary Contributions are now. KM advised the change in Maths Essential to include Book hire. KM advised VET courses are now fully user pays and we have reduced our co-contribution from \$1000 to \$250 for 1 course only in Year 11 or Year 12. This is so everyone gets something. Question raised about the CIV Education Support costs per year – need to confirm if it is \$3255 per year? Booklist for 2025 – for approval – All members given a copy for review. No questions. KM moved a motion to approve the Course Costs & Booklists as presented. Motion seconded – Esso Delaney Vote: All in favour.	
7.0	Agenda Items	
7.1	Technology Build Update – The budget blew out, so weren't getting a complete building. We have heard we are now getting it fully fitted, we are waiting for approval from DoE so build can be completed. This means we won't have hand over until the commencement of 2025. We are not getting some new equipment, they are going to refurb and reuse. This will interrupt Year 7-10 for the rest of the year. Worst case it will impact all students at commencement of 2025. We are planning for this contingency.	
	This will mean we have some spaces unused and need refurb. We have signed a lease agreement with SIDE and this money will enable us to complete these refurbs.

8.1	Good Standing Policy – amended version provided to all members, it has been sent to all families, it has been made simple and only impacts extra curricular activities. It was too hard to follow and most didn't understand, so it wasn't adhered to well. Q: How many incidence have we had of physical abuse by students, PH advised not that many, we seem to have had a shift away from that type of behaviour. We put a lot of money and resources into supporting our high end needs students. We are currently putting together data about the types of incidence and how many. We work well with our kids who are frustrated with being at school to move them onto more appropriate training and employment. Vape questions – do we have a problem? Yes everyone has a problem. They impact the use of toilets. Hopefully now they are illegal, it will become less and less.
